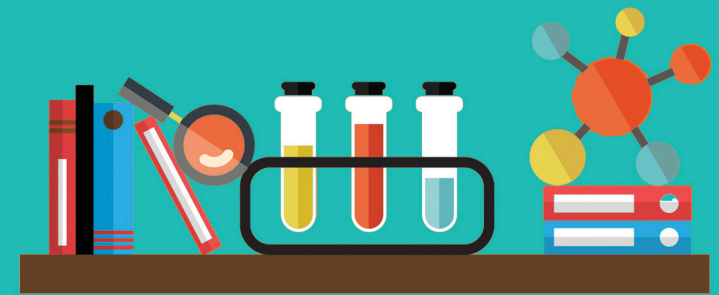

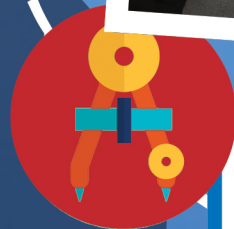
Every student taking part receives a goody bag and certificate!
